Be it remembered that at a meeting of the male members of the first Universalist Society of Amsterdam held at the Lodge in the village and town of Amsterdam on the 5th day of January A.D. 1833 agreeable to public notice & according to the Statute incorporating & regulating Religious Societies in such case made and provided, Welcome N. Chase and Joshua Martin were duly nominated & elected to preside at said meeting & to certify and return the proceedings thereof to the Clerk of said County that at said meeting it was unanimously resolved & agreed that said society should forever hereafter be known & distinguished by the name and title of the First Universalist Society in the town of Amsterdam; that the following persons were then and there duly elected Trustees to wit: Matthias Bovee, James Sanders and Bethuel Dean, and that said Trustees and their successors shall forever hereafter be known & called by the name and title of "The Trustees of the First Universalist Society in the town of Amsterdam." In Witness Whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals this 5th day of January A.D. 1833[.]
