

**Aurelius, Cayuga Co. NY
(Auburn)**

We do certify that a Meeting of Universalists was holden at the School House on the Academy Green in the village of Auburn town of Aurelius and County of Cayuga (being the usual place of holding said meeting) for the purpose of forming a society, pursuant to notice given according to law When W. Azor Brown and Lyman Paine were chosen to preside over said meeting. The meeting then proceeded to choose three trustees agreeable to acclamation for that purpose and Elijah Swift[,] George Standart and Lyman Paine were chosen, That it was resolved that the Society thus formed with said Trustees and their Successors be known and called by the name of the First Universalist Society in the Village of Auburn. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this 12th day of April 1821.—
