Notice having been given according to law that a meeting of the denomination of Christians called Universalists would be held at the meeting house in Burlington Flats on the ninth day of May eighteen hundred twenty nine at one o.clock P.M. for the purpose of incorporating themselves into a Society agreeable to the Statute in such case made & provided, the members of said denomination having assembled at the time and place above mentioned & being called to order did proceed to nominate William Park Esq. & Elijah Hubbel to preside at said meeting or election to receive the votes of the electors & to return the names of the persons who by plurality of votes should be elected to serve as Trustees for the said congregation or society[.] Therefore we the undersigned do certify that Ambrose Hulbert, Josiah Mack & Moses B. Smith were elected to serve as Trustees for the congregation or society[,] that the name or title by which the said Trustees & their successors in office shall forever hereafter be called & known shall be the Trustees of the First Universalist Society of Burlington—
