Be it remembered that at a meeting of the male members of the Universalist Society held in the Union Church in the town of Canton on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of March 1836 pursuant to public notice and according to the Statute incorporating and regulating Religious Societies in such case made and provided[,] Daniel Walker and Daniel Mack were duly nominated and elected to preside at said meeting & to certify and return the proceedings thereof to the Clerk of said County—That at said meeting it was unanimously resolved and agreed that said Society should forever hereafter be known and distinguished by the name and title of the "First Universalist Society in the town of Canton"—That the following persons were then and there duly elected Trustees of said Society to wit:— Samuel Buck, Joseph Ames 2<sup>d</sup> and Minot [Davison?], and that said Trustees and their successors shall forever hereafter be known and called by the name and title of "The Trustees of the First Universalist Society in the town of Canton[.]" In witness whereof were have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and year first above written.
