Whereupon it was unanimously voted this society shall be incorporated and known as the First Universalist Society of Cicero, N.Y. The following persons were then duly elected trustees for such society to take charge of the temporalities thereof viz: Judson Wicks, Cornelius Cronkhite, J. H. Young, S. Overacre, Henry McNeal. We the undersigned do hereby certify that the above or foregoing is a just and correct account of the proceedings of the meeting mentioned therein. Given under our hands and seals this 6th day of Feb. 1860.
