The undersigned two of the members of the religious society hereafter mentioned do hereby certify that on the 9th day of May 1876, the persons of full age belonging to the religious society worshipping [sic] in the building known as the First Universalist Society of the town of Duanesburgh and vicinity met at the place of public worship aforesaid in the town of Duanesburgh, Schenectady County, New York, for the purpose of incorporating themselves and did then and there elect, by plurality of voices, Benjamin Keaton, [F. S.?] Peck, William Broeffle, Geo. M. Lester, Alonzo Hewett, M. R. Victory and J. T. [Perkins?], as trustees of the said church corporation, and the said persons did then and there also determine by the like plurality of voices, that the said trustees and their successors shall forever hereafter be called and known by the name or title of the "First Universalist Society of Duanesburgh and Vicinity."
