

Glenville, Charlton & Ballston, Saratoga Co. NY

We the undersigned, Uriah Gregory & David Low appointed returning officers of an election of Trustees for the first Universalist Society of the towns of Glenville, Charlton and Ballston do hereby certify & declare that on the twenty fourth day of November 1832, the members of the said Society assembled at the house of Amos Smith in the town of Charlton[,] fifteen days notice of the time and place of holding the said meeting having been given in the manner required by law at which meeting Aaron Carl & Solomon G. Hamblin of Glenville[,] Eleazer Dows of Charlton & Uriah Gregory of Ballston were unanimously elected Trustees for the said Society under the name & title of the first Universalist Society of the towns of Glenville, Charlton & Ballston. Given under our hands & seals this twenty fourth day of November 1832[.]
