Be it remembered that at a meeting of the male members of the First Universalist Society, held at the church in the town of Greenfield, on the twenty seventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three, pursuant to publick notice, and according to the Statute incorporating and regulating religious societies, in such case made and provided: John Harris and Henry Peacock were duly nominated and elected to preside at said meeting, and to certify and return the proceedings thereof to the Clerk of County—That at said meeting, it was unanimously resolved and agreed, that said society should forever hereafter be known and distinguished by the name and title of "The First Universalist Society in the Town of Greenfield—That the following persons were then and there duly elected trustees of said society, to wit: George Sax, Thomas Dibble, George Riddell, Mark A. Child, John Harris and John E. Harris, and that said trustees and their successors shall forever hereafter be known and called by the name and title of "The trustees of the First Universalist Society in the town of Greenfield." In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals the day and year above written[.]
