Green, Henry While—each of whom was above the age of twenty one years, a citizen of the State of New York, and has statedly worshipped with, and has been considered as belonging to the Universalist Society of Poolville aforesaid, that fifteen days previous notice of said meeting having been given, therefore, pursuant to law[:]

that K. W. Nash and A. K. Spaulding were nominated by a majority of said members to preside at said election

that by a plurality of voices said persons did proceed to elect a board of Seven Trustees of said Universalist society consisting of the following named persons, to wit, Geo. E. Beach, C. D. Green, C. W. Brainard, Geo. E. Nash, J. J. Crandall, K. W. Nash and A. K. Spaulding they being discreet persons to take charge of the temporalities of the church hereby organized

that said Corporation or Church is to be known as the First Universalist Church of Poolville, N.Y. and that said Trustees and their successors shall forever hereafter be known as the Trustees thereof.
