Henderson, Jefferson Co. NY (Salisburys Mills)

- 1. At a numerous meeting of the citizens of the town of Henderson attended at the village of Salisburys Mills on the 27th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty eight, after due notice had been publicly given according to the statute of this State which provides for the incorporation of religious societies, Rev. P. [Pitt] Morse presiding as moderator, it was almost unanimously voted that we proceed to organize a society to be denominated the First Universalist Society in Henderson & Jedediah Stanley & Caleb Harris were appointed to receive votes for trustees.
- 2. Voted that three Trustees be appointed.
- 3. On counting the votes it was found that David Montague, Amasa Hungerford & Chester Barrett were elected Trustees.
- 4. Immediately after the election of Trustees, they were divided by lot into three classes numbered one, two, three[.] Chester Barrett of the first class to hold office one year, Amasa Hungerford of the second class to hold office two years & David Montague of the third class to hold office three years[.]
