1st Resolved, that Joseph Wetmore and Eliphalet Sears preside, canvass and certify the proceedings of the meeting.

2nd Resolved that this meeting will elect seven trustees[,] persons to take

charge of, and manage the temporalities of said society.

3^d Resolve [sic] that this Society shall be known and distinguished by the name of "The First Universalist Society in Leyden, Lewis County," all which we do accordingly certify, and we do accordingly certify and declare that Otis Munn, James Brooks, Joseph Burnam, Eliphalet Sears, Armstrong Malcom, (Alford?) Day and Ezra Miller were duly elected trustees of said Society. Given under our hands and seals the day and year first above written.
