## Lima, Livingston Co. NY

Pursuant to public notice legally given a number of the inhabitants of Bloomfield<sup>1</sup>, Lima and Mendon<sup>2</sup> convened this 12<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1825 at said Lima for the purpose of organizing themselves into a religious society agreeable to law and chose Daniel Buzzel clerk of said meeting. Eliphalet Huntington and Ezra Davis were nominated and chosen to preside in said meeting,

first—voted that this society shall be denominated[,] distinguished and known in law as the first Universalist Society in Lima, county of Livingston & State of New York

second—voted that six trustees be chosen to transact the temporal concerns of said society, to retain their offices by rotation in consonance to law in such cases made and provided—

third—voted that E. Huntington[,] Denick Knickerbacker[,] Zebulon Townsend, Elias D. Wright, John Case & Seth Potter be said trustees—

fourth—voted that this meeting be adjourned to the first Saterday [sic] of September next [at] 10 o'clock A.M. to meet at the School House near Smiths Mills[,] West Bloomfield—
