We the undersigned John Eaton and Paul Hawes having been nominated by a Majority of the members present who have statedly worshipped with and been considered as belonging to the first Uneversalist society in the Towns of Middlebury and Covington in the county of Genesee to preside at a Meeting of said Society held pursuant to the third section of an Act to provide for the incorporation of Religious societies passed April 5<sup>th</sup> 1813 do hereby certify that at said meeting held at the Dwelling house of P. Hawes in S. Middlebury on the 13<sup>th</sup> January 1821 agreeable to previous notice voted that Timothy Cruttendon[,] Peleg Ewell & Samuel W. Curtis be Trustees of said society and it was resolved that the said trustees and their successors in office shall forever hereafter be called and known by the name and title of the trustees of the first Universalian Society in the towns of Middlebury and Covington[.] Given under our hands and seals this 13<sup>th</sup> day of January 1821 at Middlebury aff<sup>s</sup>.
