The following persons were duly elected the first board of trustees of said Society viz Samuel A. Parker[,] James Bradley[,] Benjamin F. Bunker[,] Cornelius Schenck[,] Edward Cornell[,] Jacob D. V. Wycoff and Benjamin S. Hendrickson.
