At a meeting held at the Franklin Hall in West Oswego on the eighth day of May one thousand eight hundred and fifty by a number of the inhabitants of the city and town of Oswego who believing in the doctrine of the Universal Salvation and the final restitution of all things and being desirous of promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ our Saviour as preached by all the holy apostles and prophets since the world began[,] previous notice having been given agreeably to the act for the incorporation of religious societies[,] the undersigned were called to preside over said meeting at which time the following persons were unanimously elected trustees for said society viz. Jacob Whitmarsh[,] Harvey Gray[,] Samuel R. Taylor[,] R. Brockway and Portius F. Parsons[,] said Society to be known & distinguished by the name and title of the first Universalist Society of Oswego[.] Given under hands and seals this eighth day of May one thousand eight hundred and fifty[.]
