Flagler Moderator. Resolved, that the society be called the first Universalist Society in the Town of Perry as aforesaid[.] Resolved, that Josiah Waltham, Dan Dickerson and James H. Bolton be the Trustees of said society[.] Resolved, that the annual meeting for the choice of trustees to be held on the first Tuesday of October next. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this eighth day of Oct. in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one[.]
