Be it remembered that at a meeting of the male members of the Universalist Society held at the Masonick [sic] Hall in the town of Salina on the 13th day of December 1837 pursuant to public notice, & according to the statute incorporating & regulating religious societies, in such case made and provided, Samuel P. Smith & Noah Wood were duly nominated & elected to preside at said meeting & to certify & return the proceedings thereof to the Clerk of said County— That at said meeting it was unanimously resolved & agreed that said Society should forever hereafter be known & distinguished by the name & title of "The First Universalist Society in Salina." That the following persons were then & there duly elected trustees of said Society, to wit: Noah Wood, James Fifield & William Clark, & that said trustees & there [sic] successors shall forever hereafter be known & called by the name & title of "The Trustees of the First Universalist Society in Salina." In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals the day & year above written[.]
