TABLET PLACED IN NEW CHURCH Impressive Ceremonies Held at Hornellsville ADDRESS BY REV. DR. ATWOOD

Tablet Takes the Place of Corner Stone in New Edifice Being Built by Universalists—Church Will be Built of New Sand Brick

Hornellsville, Nov. 16.— An impressive ceremony was held at the new Universalist Church at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon, when the tablet was placed in the foundation of the church, which takes the place of the cornerstone. The tablet is of bronze, suitably lettered, and its placing was an occasion of considerable moment to the members of the new church, as well as to all others interested in the church history of this city. There was a very large attendance of the members of the church, the pastors of the other churches of the city, and those interested in the new edifice.

The principal address of the occasion was made by Rev. Dr. Atwood, general superintendent of the Universalist Church, after the tablet together with a number of mementos, and the first sermon of the new pastor, had been properly placed into the foundation of the new structure. He was followed by the Rev. H. P. Morrell, of Buffalo, who spoke on the place a liberal church holds in a community. A number of other shorter addresses were made suitable to the time an occasion.

The new church, which is on the corner of Genesee and Church streets, will when completed be a beautiful edifice. It is built of the news and brick which are of a gray color and give a softened effect to the building. At the present time only the basement will be finished, but when complete the church will have fine parlors, a reading room, dining room and kitchen, lavatory, and everything to be found in the most approved structures of the kind.

In the rear of the auditorium there will be placed a fine memorial window in honor of the late Rev. L. H. [Lyman Hamilton] Squires, who came here from Rochester and whose plans were followed in the construction of the edifice. Rev. Charles Petty is the pastor.

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
