PASTOR IN CORTLAND DIES AFTER ILLNESS

A Courtland [Cortland] dispatch to the Syracuse Post-Standard, dated October 31st, has the following concerning the death of a Cooperstown pastor:

The Rev. W. G. Cortright, forty-five, pastor of the Universalist Church at Courtland, died at the parsonage on Elm street at 10 o'clock this morning after an illness of several months.

Shortly after he became ill he was taken to the Parker hospital at Sayre, Pa., where he submitted to an operation. After two weeks' treatment at the hospital he was taken to the home of his sister, Mrs. L. A. Evans, at Sayre, where he remained until October 15th, when he was brought to his home in Courtland.

Mr. Cortright was a native of Pennsylvania. He was educated for the ministry at St. Lawrence University at Canton. He was ordained at Friendship, which was his first charge. From there he went to Cooperstown, where he remained three years. He came to Courtland last October.

The Rev. Mr. Cortright was president of the Allegheny Ministerial Association two years. He was a member of the Masonic Order, Odd Fellows, Macabees and Order of the Eastern Star.
