REV. C. R. EAST DIES IN FERRYHOUSE

The Rev. Charles R. East, formerly pastor of the Universalist Church of Good Tidings [Fourth Universalist], Stuyvesant avenue and Madison Street, Brooklyn, but of recent years President of a cocoanut oil company, died in the Thirty-ninth Street ferry house, Manhattan, on Thursday, shortly after he was stricken with a hemorrhage while returning from a fishing trip. The body was identified by his sister, Miss Ida R. East, yesterday morning, who directed that it be taken to her home at 217 Madison Street, Brooklyn. The reason for this is the fact that Mrs. East gave birth to a baby only four days ago, and it was feared that she might not survive the shock. Mr. East was 41 years old and lived at 445 Forty-first Street, Brooklyn.
