H. W. HAYNES, FORMER CITY PASTOR, DIES

The Rev. Harold W. Haynes, 79, a former pastor of Binghamton's First Universalist Church, died last night in a Goffstown, N. H., hospital.

Mr. Haynes, who was residing in Goffstown at the time of his death, was pastor of the Binghamton church from 1931 to 1940, when he accepted a call to the First Universalist Church of Herkimer.

A native of Maine, Mr Haynes was graduated from Bowdoin College and St. Lawrence University Divinity School. He was a thirty-second degree Mason, and while in Binghamton, was at one time president of the Exchange Club. He also served several terms as president of the Cayuga-Chenango Universalist Association.

The former Binghamton pastor is survived by his son, Stephen Haynes, and a daughter, Carolyn Haynes, both of Goffstown. The funeral service for Mr. Haynes will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday at Goffstown.
