Rev. Henry B. Taylor

The Rev. Henry Butterfield Taylor, D. D., died at Fort Plain, N.Y., on Saturday, May 12, after an illness extending over a period of several months. Dr. Taylor at the time of his death was the minister in charge of the Universalist Church [of the Messiah] at Fort Plain, where he had been located for the past three years. He has for years been prominent in the ministry and counsels of the Universalist Church, and was a graduate of Tufts College. In 1925 he received the degree of Doctor of Divinity from his Alma Mater.

Dr. Taylor has had charges in Minneapolis, Minn.; Muncie, Ind.; Marion, Mass.; Meriden, Conn.; and various other places. He had traveled much abroad and was a man of brilliant mind and scholarly attainments. He was most energetic and a great organizer in church work, to which he devoted his life. Wherever Dr. Taylor lived and worked there was he loved and esteemed. Universalism has suffered a loss in his untimely taking away. Besides his wife, who was formerly Mrs. Frances Barnett Brennan, he leaves one daughter, Laura Louise, a student at St. Lawrence University, Canton, N.Y. Interment was made at Mt. Albion cemetery [in Albion NY] on Monday.
