Final Tribute Paid William R. Andrews

Friends and relatives, numbering more than 100, paid their final respects yesterday to William Robert Andrews, 74, philanthropist and civic leader, at funeral services at the home, 1818 W. Genesee st, at 3 o'clock. The body was placed in the Oakwood Cemetery chapel vault, where it will rest pending the selection of a permanent burial place. Mr. Andrews died Friday after having led an active life as a farmer and leader in civic and philanthropic enterprises. The service was conducted by Rev. Dr. Frederick W. Betts, pastor of First Universalist Church, and a lifelong friend of Mr. Andrews. Active bearers were Edward, James and Charles Andrews, brothers; Frank Andrews and William S. Carter, nephews; Charles Hudson, Dr. Eric France and Howard Marvin. Among those who filed past the flower-decked bier to pay final tribute to the leader were Mayor Marvin; Alderman Papworth of the Seventh Ward, in which Mr. Andrews lived; Lucius Killey, a vice president of First Trust & Deposit Company; Myron S. J. Terpening, a deputy of the New York State Grange, and Charles Barnes, past master of Geddes Grange, of which Mr. Andrews was treasurer.
