MRS. CARRIE BALLOU Death Comes to Aged Woman After Two Years of Failing Health

Mrs. Carrie Payne Ballou, widow of Prof. Charles Ballou, died at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the apartment of her only daughter, Mrs. Maude Hoover, in the Century building, after two years of failing health, aged 78 years. For the past two or three weeks her condition was such that death had been expected almost daily.

Mrs. Ballou was born at Michigan City, Ind., January 1, 1837, a daughter of Welcome and Martha B. Lynde Payne, who forty years were residents of Antwerp. Her father was one of the pioneer settlers in the town of Rossie near Somerville. The subject of this sketch was married to Charles Ballou, a Boonville man, about 55 years ago, and later they located in Buffalo where they resided for years. Mr. Ballou followed teaching for many years. He died about 20 years ago and his widow came here about five years later. She was a well known and most highly esteemed woman. She was a member of the Universalist church.

Besides her daughter she is survived by one son, Fred Ballou of Buffalo, and one brother, S. W. Payne, a well known druggist of this village.

Funeral services were conducted from the late home at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon by Rev. J. A. Dickson of this village and the body was taken to Antwerp on the 4:30 train for burial.
