Miss J. Bloodough Paid Final Tribute

DOLGEVILLE, N.Y.—The funeral services for Miss Jennie Bloodough, who died suddenly of angina pectoris Saturday morning, were held yesterday at the Universalist church, Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton officiating. Interment was made in the local cemetery. The Rising Sun Rebekah lodge was in charge of the service.

Miss Bloodough, one of the oldest employes [sic] in active service of the Daniel Green Co., of this village, had been at work all day Friday and seemed in the best of health. She became suddenly ill in the early morning hours and Dr. D. M. Griffith was called but she was beyond help. She was in the employ of the Daniel Green Co. for more than 36 years.
