DEXTER WOMAN DIES AFTER SHORT ILLNESS Mrs. Walter J. Christie Victim of Disease Fatal to Sister (Special to the Times)

Dexter, March 3.—Mrs. Mabel M. Christie, wife of Walter J. Christie, died today after an illness of ten days with influenza and pneumonia, aged 39 years and six months. A sister, the late Mrs. John Huff of Glen Park, succumbed to the same disease during the epidemic of 1918.

Mrs. Christie was born in Canada, Aug. (4?) 1880, the daughter of John and the late Margaret Grant Stuart. Her marriage to Mr. Christie took place 16 years ago and she had since made her home in this village.

Surviving besides the husband and father, who made his home with his daughter, are one daughter, Margaret Christie, and a son, Stuart, both of this village; three brothers, George Stuart of Toronto, Canada, John Stuart of Colon, Panama, and William E. Stuart of Toronto; five sisters, the Misses Anna and Florence Stuart of Toronto, Canada, Mrs. W. J. (Corsaire?) of Greenfield, Mich., and Mrs. A. Morgan of Toronto, Canada, and Mrs. H. C. Fowks of Akron, O.

Mrs. Christie was a member of the Ladies' Guild of the Universalist church and also of the Ladies' Auxiliary, Sons of Veterans.

The funeral will be held Friday afternoon at 2 from the home, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed of the All Souls Universalist church, Watertown, officiating. Burial will be made at Dexter cemetery.
