W. H. DUGUID OF CORFU DIED SUDDENLY TODAY
FOUND LIFELESS IN HIS CHAIR BY HIS HOUSEKEEPER

Corfu, Feb. 24.—William H. Duguid died suddenly this morning at 7:40 o'clock in his chair at his home about a mile west of Corfu. He had apparently been feeling as well as usual, having eaten breakfast this morning. He was found dead in the chair by his housekeeper, Mrs. Eva Aylsworth, a few minutes after breakfast.

Mr. Duguid was born at Pavilion on April 20, 1834. On March 23, 1862, he married Miss Electa Julia Kinne of Corfu, who died on January 8, 1893. He was a member of the Corfu Grange. He had lived on the farm where he died for fifty years. He leaves a son, Roy K. Duguid, and a daughter, Mrs. George H. Phelps, both of Buffalo; two brothers, Manfred Duguid of Le Roy and Nelson Duguid of Roanoke and a sister, Mrs. Sarah Pinney of Roanoke.

Funeral services for Mr. Duguid will be held from his late home at 2 o'clock on Monday afternoon. The Rev. Harry M. Wright of Hornell [Universalist], formerly of Corfu, will officiate. The burial will take place in the Evergreen Hill cemetery at Corfu. Flowers are gratefully declined.
