DEATHS.

In Marcellus, Onondaga county, January 12th, ALEXANDER ENOS, Esq., aged 87 years. Father E. was a soldier in the Revolution—was one of the first settlers of Whitestown, Oneida county—had rejoiced un the faith of the restitution for 50 years, and in his last illness, when the “silver cord was being loosed, and the golden bowl broken,” he called his friends [i.e. family] around him, embraced them; and kissing them, exhorted them to continue in the faith, for he now felt that Universalism was the only thing that could render glorious the dying hour. His funeral was attended on the Tuesday following at the house of his son where he died, and the consolations of the Gospel were tendered to a numerous company of sorrowing and sympathizing friends, from I Cor. xv:55 by
