TWO PROMINENT PERSONS DEAD [abridged]

Two prominent retired business men died last night—Franklin L. Fales suddenly at his home, 1614 Fifth Avenue, and Isaiah Hall at his residence, 407 Second Street. A peculiar coincidence is that both men were in business in the vicinity of Franklin Square about the same time.

Mr. Fales suffered a stroke of apoplexy about 9:30 o'clock last evening and died at 11:40 o'clock. He had been about as usual in the evening, and as he started up the stairs in his home complained of feeling weak. He was assisted to his room. Mr. Fales spent practically his entire life in this city and for many years conducted a wholesale pork store on River Street, near Grand. He retired some little time ago. He was one of the most prominent members of the Universalist Church and served as its Treasurer for twenty-five years. He was also a member of the Trojan Wheelmen. The survivors are his wife and two sons, Walter L. Fales of Kingston and Edmund Fales of this city, and two daughters, Misses Clara and Grace Fales. The funeral arrangements had not been made this morning.
