Mrs. Eliza Grant, widow of the late Eliab T. Grant, Sr. of this village, died Monday in Odell, Ill., aged 92 years and 6 months. Notwithstanding her extreme age Mrs. Grant had been about, and in good health as usual, up to about three months ago, when she began to succumb to the infirmities of old age, and gradually fail.

Mrs. Grant was born in Rhode Island in 1806, where she was married, at Cumberland Hill, to Mr. Grant, whose home was there. In 1836 or 1837 they came to Newark, living first on the corner where O. H. Allerton's house now stands, fifty-eight years ago going to live in the old home at the corner of Main and East Miller streets. Mr. Grant died in 1865, Mrs. Grant continuing to live at the home with her son and his wife till twelve years ago when she went to live with her daughter in Illinois.

Mrs. Grant was a kind hearted woman, respected and liked by all, and she had many warm friends, most of whom have preceded her to the unknown land. Several children were born to Mrs. Grant, only two of whom are now living, Mrs. P. [Philander] W. [Mary W.] Kenyon of Odell, Ill. and E. [Eliab] T. Grant of this village, cashier and one of the directors of the First National Bank. The remains were brought to Newark at 10:40 on the Central this forenoon, and a funeral service will be held at the residence of Mr. Grant at four o'clock this afternoon, Rev. Mr. Sias, who is supplying the Universalist pulpit, officiating.
