## MRS. LENA P. GREEN DIES

Mrs. Lena A. Payne Green, 87, widow of Floyd L. Green, died this morning at 7:50 at the House of the Good Samaritan. Mrs. Green had been in failing health for nearly a year and a half.

Mrs. Green was born Feb. 22, 1879 in the town of Champion, daughter of Adelbert E. and Elizabeth L. Payne. She attended Tylerville schools and taught there before her marriage.

She was married to Floyd L. Green of the town of Pinckney Feb. 23, 1898 in a ceremony performed at the parsonage of the All Souls Universalist church, Rev. B. B. Gibbs, then pastor, officiating.

They resided on a farm in the town of Rutland following the marriage, but after a year Mr. Green began work for New York Air Brake company and they lived on Colorado avenue for 13 years.

Mr. and Mrs. Green moved to a farm in the town of Rutland at about 1912, which they operated for 12 years. They returned to this city in 1924, purchasing a home at 510 South Hamilton street, and two years later built a home at 514 South Hamilton street.

Mr. Green operated a grocery store on South Hamilton street for 18 years.

The couple moved to a cottage on Pillar Point in 1940, spending their winters in Adams until moving back to this city in 1943. After working part-time in local groceries, Mr. Green retired in 1946. He died Oct. 12, 1951.

Mrs. Green, who continued to live at the residence at 312 Central street, was a member of All Souls Universalist church.
