MRS. P D. HACKSTAFF DIES
Suffragist Was Treasurer of the New York State Association.

Mrs. Priscilla D. Hackstaff, organizer of the Bedford Political Equality League and one of the leading workers in the Woman Suffrage Party, died yesterday in her home, 864 Nostrand Avenue, Brooklyn. She left her husband, J. Frank Hackstaff, and two sons. At the request of Mrs. Hackstaff her body is to be cremated. The funeral will be held on Saturday afternoon in the Universalist Church of Our Father, Grand Avenue and Lefferts Place, Brooklyn. In St. Louis, where Mrs. Hackstaff was born, she was a school teacher, and became associated with Susan B. Anthony in the first movement for woman suffrage. Mrs. Hackstaff was president of the Bedford Political Equality League, and assisted in forming many similar organizations. She was treasurer of the New York City Federation of Woman's Clubs and of the New York State Woman Suffrage Association.
