JOHN HOMRIGHAUS, 6, FATALLY INJURED WHEN SLED CRASHES INTO AUTO AT INTERSECTION Dolgeville Boy Dies Half Hour After Being Rushed to Doctor's Office

by Ernest Swald, Utica Man and Driver of Car; Coroner Fabian States Death Was Caused by Compound Fracture of Skull.

DOLGEVILLE—John Homrighaus, six-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Homrighaus, was fatally injured yesterday afternoon in a coasting accident. The accident occurred when the sled on which the child was riding crashed into the bumper of an automobile at the inter-section on lower Van Buren street. Ernest Swald of 521 Rutger street, Utica, driver of the automobile rushed the boy to the office of Dr. H. F. Buckbee, but he was not in his office and Dr. Dayton Griffith was summoned. The boy died about a half hour later after the accident which occurred at 4 P.M.

An autopsy was performed by Drs. Buckbee and Griffith and later Coroner Dr. Fred Fabian of Little Falls, who was called here, stated that death was caused by a compound fracture of the skull.

Besides his parents the child is survived by a sister. The body was removed to the Claude Jacobson funeral home. Announcements of the services will be made later.
