—Mrs. Sadie E. Hungerford died at her home in Watertown Wednesday morning after a long illness, the last six months being confined to her bed most of the time. She was the wife of DeWitt Hungerford and daughter of (Danford?) and Mary Seaton Betts. They were both born in Henderson and lived here 34 years, when they moved to Carthage, afterwards living in Lansing, Mich., and Winnipeg, Canada, moving to Watertown three years ago. She leaves besides her husband one daughter, Mrs. W. A. Pringle of Watertown; two sisters; Mrs. W. H. Putnam of Red Wing, Minn., and Mrs. O. K. Estee of Henderson; one brother, Capt. W. C. Betts of Henderson Harbor, who is master of the steamer Charles Hubbard of the Great Lakes Steamship Co.

Mrs. Hungerford was 62 years of age and leaves many friends in her old home town who would extend sympathy to the bereaved family. There was a service held at the family home, 328 Winslow street, at 9 o'clock Friday morning, and Undertaker M. L. Burnham brought the body to the Universalist church in Henderson where the service was conducted by Rev. Gustav Ulrich at 1 o'clock p.m. The church was filled with her home friends and a profusion of beautiful flowers bore mute testimony of the loving tribute to the departed wife, mother, sister and friend. The interment was at Roberts Corners cemetery.
