Fayette King, 87, Is Laid to Rest at Sidney  
Funeral for Widely Known Citizen Is Held at Home of His Daughter

Sidney, March 21—The funeral of Fayette King, long a resident of Sidney and one of the oldest and most widely known citizens of this vicinity, was held Saturday afternoon at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Claude B. Isbell, near Rockwells Mills. The Rev. F. [Frederick] G. Leonard, pastor of the Universalist church of Morris, officiated, assisted by the Rev. George J. Scobey, pastor of the Baptist church of Mt. Upton. Burial was in Prospect Hill cemetery, Sidney. There were numerous floral tributes from friends and various organizations.

The bearers were Myron J. Kipp, Homer King, Burton C. Fairbanks, John P. Greene, Walter D. Graves and Laverne L. Pearsall.

Mr. King, was 87 years old, died Thursday morning at the Isbell home, where he had resided since 1925. He was born in Norwich Feb. 19, 1845, and his boyhood was passed at Holmesville. He married Ida V. Greene of White Store in 1867. They lived on a farm in the town of Unadilla, on a farm in the town of Pittsfield, in Sidney and at Riverside, where Mrs. King died in January, 1923.
