## James Bradford Knapp

Rites for James Bradford Knapp of Flushing, flag manufacturing official, will be conducted by the Rev. Dr. Fred C. Leining, at 1 P.M. tomorrow at the Church of the Divine Paternity [Fourth Universalist] Central Park West and 76th street, Manhattan.

Mr. Knapp died Wednesday at his home, 153-12 Sanford avenue. He was 68.

Mr. Knapp was secretary of the Annin Flag Company, Manhattan, one of the country's largest flag manufacturers. He was an officer of the firm for 20 years, and an employee for 40 years.

He was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution and the Lions Club of New York City. For many years he was an active member in the Church of the Divine Paternity. Dr. Leining, who will conduct the rites is New York State's superintendent of the Universalist Church, the denomination to which the church belongs.

Born in Potsdam, N.Y., Mr. Knapp was brought to New York by his parents when he was a child. In 1912, when he was married, he moved to Elmhurst. He was a resident of Flushing for 20 years.

Mr. Knapp leaves three sisters, Mrs. Catherine Ballou of Washington, Mrs. Jessie M. Fay of Astoria and Mrs. Edith Turner of Long Island City.

## JAMES B. KNAPP

For the past year, James B. Knapp has been in poor health due to heart trouble. His death occurred in his home at Flushing on June 9 at the age of sixty-eight. Mrs. Knapp died suddenly two years ago. Mr. Knapp was born in Potsdam and in his early childhood his parents moved to New York City. They were active in the Universalist church in the section, which is now known as Harlem. As a young man he was active in the Church of the Divine Paternity [Fourth Universalist] and in the Young People's Christian Union. This interest in the Church of the Divine Paternity continued until his death. He was a trustee of the Chapin Home at Jamaica [a Universalist facility]. He was secretary of Annin & Company, flag manufacturers, having been associated with this Company for forty years.

Dr. Samuel G. Ayres of Sotuhold and Dr. Fred C. Leining of Syracuse conducted the funeral service in the Church of the Divine Paternity on the afternoon of June 12. Burial took place in the cemetery at Flushing. Mr. Knapp is survived by three sisters: Mrs. Frank Ballou of Washington, D.C.; Mrs. Jessie M. Fay of Astoria and Mrs. Edith Turner of Long Island City.
