Randolph Landt Dead—

Randolph Landt passed unto his maker this morning. The end came after a long struggle for health, a heart difficulty being his affliction. Mr. Landt was born in the town of Danube in 1829 and resided there until 1880, when he removed with his family to this city. During those years, he followed the vocation of farming. In 1878 he formed a co-partnership with his son-in-law DeWitt Messick, under the firm name of Landt & Mesick, conducting a general store. The firm was dissolved in 1892, and Mr. Landt became a buyer for a wholesale house in Philadelphia. Of late years he had been retired. He was an ardent Republican in politics, but never held office. In 1850 he was united in marriage to Polly Jones, who survives, together with five brothers, Sanford of Los Angeles, Calif., Charles of Chicago, Ill., Isaac of Pitton, Ia., Jerry of Larnar, Ill., and Dr. William Landt of Mohawk; also by twin sisters, Mrs. Calvin [Catherine] Harder of this city, and Mrs. Melissa Agne of Cedar Rapids, Ia. Also by three grandchildren, Irene, Alton, and Blanche Mesick. The funeral will be held from the late home, (???) Garden street, on Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. J. S. Cutler, pastor of the First Universalist Church officiating. Interment in Church Street Cemetery.
