Ill but a few days from appendicitis, and operated upon Monday, Mrs. Charles J. Lumley died at 2:30 this morning at her home on Main street. The funeral will be held Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the deceased's late home, Rev. G. [George] A. Gay of Little Falls officiating, assisted by Rev. Dr. [Herbert Frank] Moulton, pastor of the Fort Plain Universalist church, which Mrs. Lumley attended.

The deceased's maiden name was Miss Jennie Kyser; she was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Kyser, was 38 years old, a native of this town, and her whole life was passed here, barring a brief residence in Amsterdam. Mrs. Lumley was an agreeable, congenial woman who had and deserved many friends with whom she was exceptionally popular. Until attacked by appendicitis, she was apparently in perfect health and her death has shocked and saddened not only those to whom she was near and dear, but [also] the people of this community generally.

The deceased is survived by her husband, two sisters and six brothers: Miss Carrie Kyser, Amsterdam; Mrs. James Fisher, Schenectady; Elmer, Little Falls; Clark, Nelliston; George, Nicholson, Pa.; Eugene, Schenectady; Seward, Amsterdam; [and] James, Binghamton.
