Sudden Death in Bridgewater.

Mrs. Rosamond Palmer, wife of Herbert E. Palmer of the village of Bridgewater, died suddenly at her home Monday afternoon of apoplexy. Mrs. Palmer had been in the best of health and performed her customary household duties up to 2 p.m. when she was found by her husband unconscious in the yard. She was immediately taken into the house and medical aid summoned, which was of no avail, death ensuing about 5 o'clock. She did not regain consciousness after being discovered.

Rosamond Brown was born in Morrisville, July 25, 1848, and was the only daughter of Duane Brown, Esq., a prominent lawyer of Madison County, who died when she was a child. In 1877 she became the wife of Herbert E. Palmer of Bridgewater, and has since lived there, her only brother, Thurston Brown, soon after locating near by. She was a noble-hearted woman, beloved by all and most generous and kindly disposed. No one left her door in need if she was in any way able to render assistance. She is survived by her husband, brother, and young daughter, Ruth L, who have the sincere sympathy of their many friends and neighbors. The funeral was held at the house Thursday at 2 p. m., Rev. Daniel Ballou of Utica [a Universalist], officiating, assisted by Rev. N. S. Aller, of Bridgewater. The attendance was unusually large, friends and relatives from distant places as well as immediate neighbors being present to show the high esteem in which she was held. The floral tributes were many and beautiful. Interment was made at Fairview cemetery.
