DEACON A. M. PECK, 72, OF ALL SOULS CHURCH, DIES

Alfred Martin Peck, 72 years old a former well-known resident of the Eastern District for many years and connected with the printing ink firm of J. M. Huber at 65 W. Houston st., Manhattan, died on Monday at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Frederick H. Wilkinson, 682 E. 18th st., Flatbush, where he had made his home since the death of his wife in 1916. Mr. Peck was a prominent member and deacon of All Souls Universalist Church, Ocean and Ditmas aves., and the pastor, the Rev. Dr. A. Eugene Bartlett, will conduct his funeral services this evening at 8 o'clock. The interment tomorrow will be in Greenwood Cemetery. Mr. Peck was born in old New York City, the son of the late Peter and Amanda Pelsang Peck. He came to old Williamsburg in 1865 and lived for many years on S. 5th st. He married Jane Ferris, the daughter of William Ferris and the sister of William and Alexander Ferris, both prominent members for years of the Brooklyn Board of Education. Mr. Peck was a staunch Republican and for many years active in the old 13th Ward Republican Association. He had attended All Souls Church for many years when it was located in the Eastern District, became a member of the church under the pastorate of Dr. Bartlett and was a member of the Men's Club of the church. Mr. Peck is survived by two sons, Alfred E. Peck and Harry Alexander Peck; two daughters, Mrs. Wilkinson and Mrs. George S. Peabody; three grandchildren and a sister, Mrs. Edward Romaine.
