DEATHS.

In this village, on the 14th inst., Mrs. MARY PULLEN, wife of Mr. Jedediah Pullen, in the 31st year of her age.

Mrs. P. was an amiable woman, a good neighbor, and a pleasant and agreeable companion. She and her *now* disconsolate partner in life were constant attendants at the Universalist church in this place, and though not members of the society, were more attached to the doctrine of Universalism than to any other sentiment.

Mrs. P. had attended meeting during the day and evening preceding her death. I saw her at the close of the evening service and spoke with her, and she appeared uncommonly cheerful and happy. She left the church for her house, which is about 80 rods distant, and a few minutes after she returned home, and while preparing to retire, she was suddenly attacked with what was supposed to be a cramp in the stomach. Medical aid was immediately summoned, but to no effect. She expired, perfectly resigned to the will of Heaven, in about 19 hours. Her funeral discourse will be delivered at the Universalist Church, in this place, on the 20th inst., (to-morrow,) at half past 1, P.M.
