Charles E. Rummer, 63, Dies in Syracuse

Dryden, Dec. 7—Charles E. Rummer of Syracuse, a former resident of Dryden, died Friday morning at the Syracuse Memorial Hospital where he underwent a major operation three weeks before.

The funeral was conducted privately from the home at 176 Forest Hill Drive, Sunday, the Rev. E. [Ellsworth] C. Reamon of the Betts Memorial [Universalist] church officiating. Masonic burial service at Willow Glen [Cemetery] was conducted by Dryden Lodge.

Mr. Rummer was born May 1, 1870, on the farm south of Dryden known now as the Halsey Donley farm. On Dec. 19, 1893, he married Miss Corrine Powers of McLean who survives him. A son born in 1901 died at the age of 1½ years.

For a number of years Mr. Rummer conducted a shoe store in the post office building in Dryden. He later moved to Cortland where he was employed by the American Express Co., and was Lackawanna [railroad] ticket agent. For about 25 years past he was Lackawanna ticket agent in Syracuse.

Mr. Rummer was a former member of Dryden Lodge, F and A. M., and was secretary eight years, but upon his removal to Syracuse he transferred his membership to Uncas Lodge of that city.

Besides his widow, Mr. Rummer is survived by his aged father, Gabriel Rummer, and his step-mother of Dryden; a brother, A. J. Rummer of Cortland; and a sister, Miss Leola Rummer of Newark, N. J.
