EMORY RUNDLE

On Tuesday evening last, the sad news reached us of the death of our friend, Emory Rundle, of Peach Lake District [on 26 Dec 1901]. He had been ill for several weeks and for some time he was known to be in a dangerous state. He was a son of the late Nathan and Martha Jane Ryder Rundle, and was born and always lived in the town. He was a man of high standing, socially, and a good farmer and neighbor, thoroughly honest and much respected by all who knew him. He was a man of great vitality and every undertaking was sure to go ahead. It was thought by many who knew him that his hard work had much to do with his broken health. Only last season he erected a large barn, which had his entire attention, and this, they think, brought on his last illness. For the last week he was a great sufferer from a complication of diseases. He was twice married, his first wife being Mary Emily Howe [1842-1891], and his second, Mrs. Elizabeth Dykeman, eldest daughter of Cyrus Rider, who survives him, with two daughters, Elsie and Martha, to mourn his loss. Deceased was 63 years, two months and 5 days of age. The funeral was held from the house on Monday and was largely attended. The pastor of the Universalist Church of North Salem officiated. Interment was in the family plot [in June Cemetery], at North Salem.
