This aged citizen and oldest pilot on the North River, died yesterday afternoon at about 1 o'clock, at his residence in this city, the cause of his decease being hernia. He was well and familiarly known to navigators of the Hudson and other waters, being one of that class of business men himself from early boyhood up to within a few years before his death. Deceased was a member of Hudson Lodge No. 7 F. & A.M., and will be buried with masonic honors. He was made a Mason in this Lodge in the year 1840. For fourteen years he was in the employ of the Van Santvoord line, and was considered one of the best pilots on the Hudson. At the time of his death deceased held the offices of Commissioner of Excise, and Superintendent of Wharves and Piers. His funeral will take place Wednesday afternoon from the Universalist church, at 3 o'clock.
