Utica, Nov. 22.—Mrs. Anna B. Seymour, wife of the late William B. Seymour, died Saturday at the home of her niece, Mrs. Anna S. Clark, 32 Eagle street, aged 90 years. She was born in 1819 in the town of Duanesbury, Schoharie [Duanesburg, Schenectady] Co. and was married to William B. Seymour of Clinton on Sept. 6, 1838, near which village she lived for many years. After leaving Clinton Mr. and Mrs Seymour lived in Iowa City, Ia., for a number of years, from which place they removed to St. Michaels, Md., where Mr. Seymour died in 1882, since which time Mrs. Seymour had made her home with friends in Westmoreland and Utica. She was one of the oldest members of the Universalist church in Oneida county. She was the daughter of the late Erastus W. Clark and Lucretia Hyde Bence of Westmoreland. Everett Clark Metcalf of Westmoreland is a nephew of Mrs. Seymour, who on her father's side was a lineal descendant of Daniel Clark of Windsor, Conn., the first secretary of state of that commonwealth of that state, who was one of the 17 persons named in the charter of Connecticut named by Charles II of England. On the maternal side she was a lineal descendant of William Hyde of Norwich, Conn.
