MRS. H.V.N. SHUTE DIES; TEACHER, CHURCHWOMAN

Mrs. Harriet Van Nostrand Shute, 76 years old, of 279 Clifton pl., formerly for many years a teacher in the Eastern District Industrial Home on 3d st., and a member of one of the oldest families of Brooklyn, died on Monday at her home, of a stroke of paralysis. Her funeral services, this evening at 8 o'clock, will be conducted by the Rev. Charles H. Vail, pastor of the Universalist Church of Good Tidings. The interment, tomorrow, will be in Cypress Hills Cemetery. Mrs. Shute was born in the old Van Nostrand homestead at Cooper and Wyckoff aves., the daughter of the late Norman and Catherine E. Everitt Van Nostrand. Her father was the editor and publisher of the Universalist Ambassador, a periodical later called the Universalist Leader, and he was a trustee in All Souls Universalist Church in its early history. He was also a trustee of the Williamsburg Savings Bank. Mrs. Shute became a member of All Souls Church during the pastorate of the late Rev. Dr. Almon Gunnison and she was formerly active in the work of the church, of which she was a member at her death. She is survived by two brothers, John E. Van Nostrand, a well-known lawyer of this city, and Abram Van Nostrand, and two sisters, Miss Kate Van Nostrand and Mrs. Ann Maria Harris of Nyack, N.Y.
