DEATH CLAIMS MRS. F. WALDIE Highly Esteemed Resident of Dolgeville Dies After Long Illness

DOLGEVILLE—Mrs. Flora M. Waldie died Wednesday at her home on Faville avenue after an extended illness from a complication of diseases. Mrs. Waldie had been confined to her bed for the past eight months. Deceased was born November 15, 1867 in Gloucester, Mass., her maiden name being Flora Thurston. In February, 1910, she was married to George Waldie, who died six years later. She taught school in her home town for 20 years, but lived in this village for many years, loved and esteemed by all who knew her.

Lane, Jr., who made his home with the deceased since the demise of his wife. Funeral services will be held this evening at 7:30 at the home and Saturday morning the remains will be taken to Gloucester for interment.
